The National Archery in the Schools Program in Iowa is coordinated through the Iowa Department of Natural Resources.

The program promotes student education and participation in the lifelong sport of Archery. The program's focus is to provide International-style target archery training in physical education classes for grades 4–12. Many states also offer leagues and competitions throughout the year.

The Iowa DNR provides NASP Basic Archery Instructor (BAI) training throughout the state to teachers and archery program organizers. **BAI training is provided at no cost to teachers** conducting NASP programs as part of a 2-week, in-school course.
