Touch, Smell and Listen Bingo

You will be taking a short ¼-mile hike along a refuge trail. As you walk along, read one of the blocks to the child/children and have them try to find the things that match the description on this list. After the child/children discover something, have them touch and smell the object as a way of finding out more about it and put an X on its block. Remember to *Leave No Trace* by not disturbing any of the objects. After touching objects outside, have children wash their hands.
