

## Display Creators Needed!

Help us fill Lake Meyer Campground with Halloween displays!

This is a family-friendly event focused on fun. Many children will be age 8 or below. Fall, nature-themed, and spooky (not scary) decorations and costumes are all welcome.

Please plan on having someone be at your display for the full two-hours of the event. Since we aren't passing out candy, we encourage you to make your displays and costumes as LARGE, FUN, and CREATIVE as possible! Most display areas have access to electricity.



**2020 Covid Precautions:** For everyone's safety, please respect the following guidelines:

- **Pre-registration required for all volunteers.**
- No passing out candy, toys, or other handouts. Please do not approach cars.
- Please stay within your designated display area.
- Wear a Covid-safe mask if approaching anyone outside of your family or "social bubble."

**Free Camping:** Volunteers receive one free night of camping and can reserve campsites for the weekend. Campers must be self-contained; tent camping is not currently allowed at Lake Meyer.

**Set-Up:** You may begin set-up on Saturday, or Friday if you are camping Friday night. We ask that campers limit use of lights, music, sound effects, etc. outside of the event hours so that all park users can enjoy their time at Lake Meyer. To help with traffic flow, please plan on being in place and ready by 2:45 on Saturday.

### Other Important Things:

- The bathrooms in the Lake Meyer Campground are closed, but a pit toilet is available at the boat dock area, a ten-minute walk or 2-minute drive.
- Please dress for the weather! In case of extreme weather, cancellation information will be posted on Facebook and our website. We will email and/or call all volunteers as soon as possible if the event must be cancelled.
